

MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

"If you want to travel fast, go alone...

I learned about this African proverb a long time ago and its wisdom led me to reflect on what we achieved at Fundación Paso del Norte in 2022.

When we began our history as a foundation, our goal was never immediate success, but lasting impact. Now, our organization has entered a stage of maturity and strength that allowed us to see beyond the borders of our community and identify opportunities to connect with new organizations, companies, and people.

With this conviction to transcend, we started the My Machine program in Ciudad Juárez, a program born in Belgium that had never been implemented in Mexico. This program fosters the creativity of children and encourages them to dream without borders to improve their community. Later we traveled to Lima and Tarapoto in Peru, to train more than 400 teachers in the Coaches Across Continents methodology that is part of our Escuelas de Bienestar program, with this initiative we were able to share our success in other latitudes. We also launched the Juárez Giving Day campaign for the first time, to replicate the successful crowdfunding case carried out by our sister foundation, the Paso del Norte Community Foundation in El Paso. Finally, PGIM Real Estate and Terrafina —companies based in Mexico City—, established a designated fund at our foundation that allowed us to grow the impact of the Juárez en Acción program with a strong economic investment to equip a park in Parajes del Sur.

These opportunities gave strength and energy to the rest of our initiatives, which during this year continued to benefit children, youth, families, and nonprofit organizations, allowing us to impact the lives of more than 34,000 people. During 2022, we were able to connect with more than 170 donors, including companies, organizations, and individuals, to whom we owe our deepest gratitude. Your generous support allowed us to mobilize and invest in the community more than \$18 million pesos and allocate them to health, well-being, violence prevention, community development, education, and culture programs.

This annual report, in addition to being a summary of everything we have achieved with dedication, responsibility, and a commitment to excellence, is the manifesto of our gratitude and appreciation to each of our donors, to the Board of Directors, and to the staff of our foundation for doing all this possible.

To achieve more and travel even further, let's continue to work together and innovate to raise the quality of life for families in our community who need it so much.

Our DNA

In 2015, Fundación Paso del Norte was founded thanks to the vision and joint efforts of leaders from Ciudad Juárez and El Paso, who sought to promote philanthropy in the region and raise the quality of life of our city's residents. With the support of the Paso del Norte Health Foundation and a grant of \$1 million in matching funds from the Woody and Gayle Hunt Family Foundation, the organization was able to begin operations and build local and international partnerships to quickly become one of the leading grantmakers in Ciudad Juárez.

Our organization has two main impact mechanisms: our projects or initiatives, and the funds that companies, individuals and organizations open in the Foundation to invest economic resources in their areas of interest.

Strategic Objetives

Our resources and efforts are focused on achieving four strategic objectives.

Strenghten the technical and financial capacity of organizations in our region.

Create opportunities that impact the development of the people of our community.

Support programs and initiatives that foster community development.

Develop strategic partnerships and charitable funds to respond to the needs in Juarez.



How does the Fundación impact these areas?

Our organization has two major work mechanisms: our initiatives and charitable funds that companies, individuals and organizations establish at our foundation to invest economic resources in the areas of their interest.





- We connected with more than 170 donors through our projects, events and funds.
 This allowed us to invest more than \$18M pesos in nonprofit organizations and community interventions.
- We partnered with My Machine Global Foundation to bring their methodology from Belgium to Ciudad Juarez. With Microsoft's sponsorship we conducted a pilot in which 70 elementary school children drew the machine of their dreams. Four drawings were selected and university and technical career students worked in teams to build the dream machines.
- We transformed our partnership with FICOSEC into a permanent fund to support
 a comprehensive strategy to prevent gender violence and child sexual violence.
 We funded the projects of 7 organizations to address this problem, jointly investing
 more than \$9M pesos.
- For the seventh year in a row, we supported the financial consolidation and expansion
 of 8 nonprofit organizations through our Challenge Grant program. By matching funds
 raised by these organizations, we invested more than \$2.8M pesos in their social
 projects.
- We started the second generation of the REALIZE Transformational Leadership program.
 This program is aimed at leaders and managers of social organizations who receive 10 months of training and support to transform their leadership skills and strengthen their organizations.
- We organized the "Entrelazando Redes para una Vida Libre de Violencia" conference in alliance with FICOSEC to promote dialogue on the progress made with regard to gender violence. The forum closed with a keynote by Olimpia Coral Melo, recognized by TIME Magazine as one of the 100 most influential people in the world.
- We successfully promoted the seventh edition of Juárez en Acción. This year, the campaign registered 19,273 participants. In addition, with the support of Terrafina, we were able to invest more than \$160,000 pesos in equipping the Bahía Blanca linear park in Parajes del Sur.
- For the first time, we held a workshop with the organization Proyecto Cantera, based in Mexico City, for physical education teachers and coaches from our Escuelas de Bienestar program. This program provides them with tools to use games and sports to teach values and develop life skills. We also traveled to Peru to give a workshop on this methodology to more than 400 participants.

Challenge **Grant**

We held the seventh edition of our Challenge Grant, a program designed to support the fundraising activities of nonprofit organizations that implement programs to improve the quality of life in our community.

Participating organizations had the goal of raising \$250,000 pesos to qualify for up to \$125,000 pesos in matching funds to be used for their social projects.

Eight agencies participated in fundraising campaigns that attracted new donors, reactivated donations, and provided access to new sources of funding.

Gender Violence Prevention Strategy

Fundación Paso del Norte and **FICOSEC Juárez** have worked together since 2016, jointly funding projects to address and prevent gender-based violence in the southeast of Ciudad Juárez.

In 2022, this partnership became a **permanent fund** at our foundation, allowing us to support 8 projects implemented by 7 nonprofit organizations. These projects offer women and at-risk children psychological services, legal support, shelter, and entrepreneurship and empowerment programs.

Conference "Entrelazando Redes para una Vida Libre de Violencia"

We organized a special conference in partnership with FICOSEC to facilitate dialogue between government and nonprofit organizations about the challenges and progress in gender violence prevention. The keynote speaker was Olimpia Coral Melo, advocate of the Olimpia Law and named by TIME Magazine as one of the 100 most influential people in the world.



Escuelas de **Bienestar**

In 2017, we teamed up with Coaches Across Continents and One World Play Project to launch a project that allowed us to reach thousands of girls and boys in preschool and elementary schools through their physical education teachers.

This program offers workshops and training for these teachers to learn a methodology that allows them to use games and sports to develop life skills and values. They also receive soccer balls and other materials that they can use to improve their classes.

Juárez en Acción

In September, we held our annual Juárez en Acción campaign to encourage the community to participate in activities and projects for cleanup, rescue of public spaces, sports, community outreach, and well-being. The response was impressive with more than **19,000 people registered**, setting a new participation record.

Juárez en Acción is the largest volunteer event in the state of Chihuahua. This movement aims to highlight the positive impact that these activities have on the city, so that more people join and become aware of these initiatives that contribute to building a better community.

My Machine

This year, we established a partnership with **My Machine Global Foundation** to bring its methodology from Belgium to Ciudad Juarez, promoting creativity and innovation in girls, boys, and university and technical careers students.

This program is an intergenerational experience of creativity and learning. Elementary school children begin by drawing the machine of their dreams. This drawing then goes to university students who must make a functional design, and finally, this design is given to students of technical careers who are tasked with building these dream machines.







Juarez Giving Day

We conducted for the first time **Juarez Giving Day**, a crowdfunding campaign to support nonprofit organizations to raise funds through **HIPGive's** digital platform and contribute to their different projects and social programs.



















Revenue Amounts shown in Pesos


